Summary of the Preparations prior to the event:	Regular meetings were held with relevant parties before the competition.
	Despite on-going preparations with the scoring system had to be replaced due to not meeting requirements.
	All other preparations were carried out as required.
Financial obligations:	All required financial obligations were met.
Venue set up:	The venue was setup correctly with no problems. Any marker discrepancies were immediately corrected and delay in any part of the event took place.
Infrastructure:	The infrastructure was well setup, and everything was in place and ready when needed.
Opening And Closing Ceremonies:	The opening ceremony met all the requirements needed. The ceremony lasted about 45 minutes followed by a competitor's briefing.
Conduct of the event:	The event was well run. Weather calls for wind were timeously implemented. The competition did manage to easily finish in the allotted time frame. The competition had 5 rejumps take place. All were during the speed event. 1 rejump for weather, 1 rejump for interference on course, 1 for a malfunction and 2 technical rejumps.
Comments to Officials, Meet Director Judges, Jury	All officials were well organised and carried out their duties in accordance with the rules. Judging was carried out effectively and efficiently. Scores were uploaded quickly, and all official results were released quickly. It must be pointed out that freestyle scores were the slowest in be released, mainly due to reviews that had to take place.
Recommendations for the Organisers:	The organisers ran a very good competition, and all aspects were well planned and carried out efficiently. The timing of the event could be a problem with the heat and the wind, and it is understood that normally the competition would be run in October for more stable weather conditions. Rule Changes – Proposals and considerations:	Some minor rule changes will be discussed by the committee. A change to clarify an error in the 2025 Freestyle rules will be made.
